INTRODUCTION

What is a Budget?

A budget shows what the government expects to collect as revenue, what grants it expects to receive, how much it expects to save or borrow, and what the government plans to spend on. A budget is a document that contains details about how the government plans to spend our communal wealth – the taxpayers' money. Federal, state and local governments all have a budget document which is called an Appropriation Act.

In a democracy, every responsible citizen has the right to know how communal wealth is being expended in the delivery of public infrastructure and services.

What is a Citizens Budget?

A Citizens Budget is a simpler, less technical version of a government's budget specifically designed to present key information that is understandable by the general public. Citizens Budgets can vary widely in focus, content, and length and be presented in a number of ways, ranging from a simple brochure to a comprehensive report. Citizens Budget should also be accessible by the general public, including being published online on an official state website.

Why is Citizens Budget Important?

Every responsible citizen has the right to know how communal wealth is being expended in the delivery of public infrastructure and services. State Governments must ensure that citizens has a good understanding on how the budget directly affects their lives.

Citizens Budget fosters a greater understanding of how public funds are utilized, especially if the information presented is in a more accessible format than standard government budgets.

Although, they are not meant to replace more detailed budget documents, they are important for informing citizens, Community based Organizations, Civil Societies and contributes to the effort of increasing government accountability on how to manage public funds.

BUDGET PROCESS

The Bayelsa State Fiscal & Transparency Law 2006 as amended in 2019 stipulates that before any money can be spent from the State's coffers, there must be a budget. In compliance with this provision, the State Budget Office at the beginning of each financial year, and in collaboration with MDAs formulate and prepare the budget after due consultation with other governmental bodies and other relevant stakeholders. The proposed budget estimates are forwarded to Executive Council (EXCO), and then later presented to the State House of Assembly as a bill for passage into law. His Excellency, the Governor signs it to become the Appropriation Law. The following pictogram depicts the four major budget process.



- 1. BUDGET FORMULATION: The Executive by extension, the State Budget Office in collaboration with MDAs, Non-Governmental Bodies and other relevant stakeholders formulates the budget after various consultative meetings in the context of the Medium Term Expenditure Framework (MTEF). The estimates or proposal that emerges is forwarded to EXCO for its inputs and then sent to the State House of Assembly.
 - **2. BUDGET APPROVAL**: The State House of Assembly reviews and amend the budget proposal and enact it into Appropriation Law, after being signed by His Excellency, the Governor.
 - **3. BUDGET EXECUTION:** The Executive collect revenue and spends as part of allocation made in the budget law at the beginning of the financial year.
 - **4. BUDGET OVERSIGHT:** The budget accounts are audited and audit findings reviewed, which requires actions to be taken by the executive to correct audit findings. This is done from the end of the first quarter, April 2020 and continues through the entire budget process.

BUDGET GLOSSARY

Budget

Budget is an estimation of revenues and expenditure of the Government over a specific period, usually a year.

Citizen Budget

Citizen Budget is a simplified, less technical version of government's budget specifically designed to present key information that is understandable by the general public.

Recurrent Expenditure

Is that part of the total government expenditure meant for monthly payment of salaries of government workers, payment of interest on debt and daily running of Ministries, Departments and Agencies of Government.

Capital Expenditure

Is that part of government total expenditures meant for development projects like schools, hospitals roads, etc in the State.

Personnel Costs

Are the part of recurrent expenditure of government used for the payment of salaries and pension of government workers.

Budget support

Is the amount given by the Federal Government to support the State to pay salaries and pensions in the event of low federal allocation.

Overhead costs

Are part of recurrent expenditure of government used for daily or periodic administrative expenses.

Debt Stock

Is the total of domestic and external debts of the government over a period of time.

Debt Servicing

Is the amount of money allocated in the budget for repayment of domestic and external debts.

Statutory Allocation

Is the allocation to the State by the Federal Government. This is determined by Federal Account Allocation Committee (FAAC).

Cash Backed Capital Expenditure

Is the amount of capital made available for execution of capital projects.

Revenue

Is the total amount generated by the government over a specified period.

Internally Generated Revenue

Is the total amount of money generated by the state government without the federal government support.

BUDGET GLOSSARY

Consolidated Revenue Fund Charge

Is that part of the budget estimate, statutorily used to pay Pensions and Gratuities.

Value Added Tax (VAT)

Is that part of revenue that is given to the state by the Federal Government from all goods sold and services rendered in the Country.

Why does the Government borrow?

When the government intends to spend more money than they expect to collect as revenue and receive in grants, the budget is in deficit.

When they intend to spend less than what they expect to collect in revenue and receive in grants, the budget is in surplus. A balanced budget is a budget where total revenues are equal to the total expenditures for the year. When the budget has an expected deficit, the government will need to finance the budget deficit. It can do this through sales of government assets or through borrowing.

ECONOMIC ASSUMPTIONS

The Bayelsa State 2024 Budget, christened (Budget of Sustainable and Shared Prosperity) is a Budget initiated by the present administration to sustain the gains made in the post covid-19 era that were crucial to quickly reposition the state's economy for accelerated, sustainable growth and impactful governance and shared prosperity.

In view of this, the 2024 budget is anticipated to be in the Deficit with borrowing envisaged to finance this gap. This is anchored in the 2024-2026 Medium Term Expenditure Framework of the State, on a projected Crude oil price of \$65 bpd, 1.6000 mbpd Oil production for 312 days, N750 Exchange rate for the dollar, 20.00% inflation rate, 25% Mineral ratio and a Real GDP of 3.00%.

The Fiscal Policy thrust of the present administration is centered on Prosperity (PROSPERITY AGENDA). The parameters inputs were captioned in order to meet the yearnings and expectations of the citizens through implementation of aggressive infrastructure, education, health, agriculture, security, business, civil servants welfare promotion and environmental programmes and policies of government. The primary message of the administration is that of diversification of the state's economy from oil and consolidation on the previous government. 







DELIVERABLES AND RESULTS EXPECTED FROM BUDGET IMPLEMENTATION

If this Budget is properly implemented, it will somehow reduce poverty, improved nutrition, ensure healthy living and gender equality as envisaged in the policy objective of the Bayelsa State Government.

GENDER, VULNERABILITY AND SOCIAL INCLUSION

The state government is very sensitive to the issues of gender, vulnerability and social inclusion. To this end, various policies and measures were targeted on women, children, the physically challenged, the elderly and the less privilege in the society. Specifically, the sum of N2.197billion is budgeted for youth and gender programmes. Thirty million naira (N30,000,000.00) out of this amount is given to disability support.

FURTHER INFORMATION

Further information not presently covered which has been agreed at the consultations proceeding the preparation of the document is the issue of local governments replicating the consultation meeting of the state. Local Council Chairmen have not been able to organize consultation meetings in their respective domains to enable village dweller to make inputs to enrich the document, as not every one of them can come to the state capital to attend the meeting.

QUASIFISCAL ACTIVITIES OF GOVERNMENT

These are activities undertaken by State owned enterprises or private sector companies at the direction of government.

- A. The Bayelsa Airport (Bayelsa Cargo Airport). With a net worth of about N60 billion is presently managed by the United Nigeria Airline and the Ibom Airline to provide local and international aviation services.
- B. The Bayelsa Plastic Industry; It's a State-owned company with a worth of about N10 billion is billed to manufacture commercial /Industrial PVC Pipes and other plastic materials.

These activities of government are targeted to boast industrialization beyond oil. The financial impact of these activities on the State is very minimal as their operational costs are directly borne by these enterprises.
